<p>Visit the Hive, St John's Library or a book shop and find some non-fiction books on either Japan or the Olympics. Take a photograph/selfie of what you find.</p>	<p>List/Draw as many Olympic events as you can. There will be a special prize if you find over 40!</p>	<p>Create a fact file on a famous Olympian / Paralympian of your choice. Find out at least 10 facts about their life, career and sporting achievements.</p>	<p>Find out about a famous Japanese shrine, temple or monastery. Can you draw and label the key features?</p>
<p>Research information on the Bullet Train. What is it? Why is it so special? Where does it go from/to? What is it's top speed? What does it look like?</p>	<p>Find 20 words, numbers or phrases in Japanese. Can you write a basic language guide to show your peers?</p>	<p>Go on a nature walk and find some examples of blossom or wild flowers. Sketch, draw or photograph the flowers and create a Japanese style piece of art showcasing their delicate design.</p>	<p>Imagine you are on holiday in Tokyo. Write a postcard to Mr Hines at Perryfields telling him all about your travels. What have you seen? What have you eaten?</p>
