#### **Book of the Month!**



The Learning Power we are focusing on at the moment is being curious:


- I can ask questions

### **Online Safety Support for Parents**

In this ever changing IT world, it is not easy to keep on top of our children's technology use and checking what they are watching and using is suitable. Help is at hand!

As part of our IT filtering and monitoring subscription, we have a free subscription to 'Qustodio Kids'. The link for this is below. This is for you to put onto your child's device and will allow you to set daily time limits on the device, filter content and monitor your child's activity/screen time. ### Happy Healthy Kidz Team - HAF

Please see the information about the holiday club being run at St Clements Primary School during the summer holidays. The programme is funded by the Department of Education on behalf of Worcestershire Council and allows children who are in receipt of benefit related Free School Meals (FSM) a free place at our holiday club during the school holidays.
