

How would you train a dragon?

Professor Yobbish's one and only rule for dragon training is rather unhelpful.

You will need

- A whiskie
- A wicker basket - with a lid
- A collar and lead
- Small bits of wood (like chicken scratch)
- A tin stick

How to train your dragon

Generally pick a really short name for your dragon which you can shout loudly.

Logical order

Next Whistle the dragon in its wicker basket, carefully put a collar around its neck, attaching it to the lead when that is done and give it a lead to the collar that is about 2 inches long.

Drawn ideas linked to the text

Start by, lift the lid on the basket, making sure you hold the lead firmly. Allow the dragon to crawl out of the basket.

Tell the dragon to sit and reward when the whistle sound loudly and look the dragon in the eyes. Go with each down to the back to encourage it to sit. If it sits give it a small treat. If it doesn't sit lift it on the nose with the stick and reward the first work.

Once you have mastered sitting, slowly teach sit the dragons back and hold on steadily. At each point reward the dragon with a tiny treat.

When you are ready to gradually kick your lead together with the dragon's, take and blow the whistle when it obeys to only give it a treat to end.

At the end of the day put 5 small treats into the basket and the dragon basket. Close the lid, making sure it has come under the stick.

Train your dragon every day. Be very slow but other reward it for doing the right thing.
