Find out about Christopher Columbus. Draw a picture and colour it in of him sailing across the Atlantic Ocean.

Find out about Scott's journey to the South Pole. Set up a photo with you as Scott pretending you are travelling through the cold weather. Be creative.

Choose your favourite football team and find out about one of their players. Make a poster about them.

Make a Space Rocket for a future mission to Mars. Use things that you would normally put in the recycling.

Choose a country you would love to visit. Create an information poster about it. Make it sound really good so other people will want to go.

Each half-term, we will be issuing each child with a homework grid with a selection of different homework tasks on. The tasks will link to key skills and values. As you complete each task, please date and sign the box and return the evidence to school. The evidence could be a drawing, a photo/video, some writing — a poem, letter, short story or report, a model or an object. Try to aim for 1-2 tasks per week.
